Membership Requirements

Fall 2001

1. All members may not miss more than two biweekly business meetings. If a member is unable to attend a meeting, they must notify the Secretary. If the member misses more than two unexcused business meetings, the member will be placed on probation until reviewed by the executive board.

1. All EMT's who respond to campus calls must:
 1. Maintain a current American Heart Association or American Red Cross Professional Rescuer CPR certification
 2. Complete the blood borne pathogens training and alcohol education session
 3. Maintain a current North Carolina EMT certification

In the event that any of the above certifications are lost for ANY reason, the EMT must notify the Personnel Officer. The EMT will remain out of service until all certifications have been renewed

1. Each EMT is required to attend all training and orientation sessions organized by the Training Officer, and must demonstrate proficiency in EMS/BLS

***** All training sessions missed must be made up**

1. Each EMT is responsible for his/her shift. All shifts will be filled on a monthly basis. Each EMT must fill at least five shifts per month or as otherwise determined by the Personnel Officer. **If an EMT is unable to cover a shift, he/she must find another EMT to fill the shift and must**

notify the Personnel Officer of the changes. In the event that a suitable cover cannot be found, the Personnel Officer must be notified.

1. Failure to comply with the rules and regulations of the Wake Forest Emergency Response Team are grounds for dismissal. Every member is responsible for and expected to follow all rules and regulations listed and all those listed in the Standard Operating Procedures.
